

# Beholding the Glory of the Lord



This Sunday, Pastor Jonathan will share part 8 of a series through 2 Corinthians. In chapter 3, verses 17 and 18 we read the following: "Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. And we all, with unveiled face, beholding the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another. For this comes from the Lord who is the Spirit."

We'll be considering two questions:

- Why doesn't everyone see the gospel as glorious?
- What should happen when a person sees the gospel as glorious?

#### **Missionary Update:**

We received the email below from Ben & Krista Taylor who are serving as missionaries in Poland. (This is the same email that was read during our Worship Service on February 27.)

Some people have asked how we are doing in Poland. Here is a brief update so you can pray!

On Thursday Putin launched a full-scale invasion on Ukraine. Poland borders Ukraine to the west.

Right now we are safe. We live in Wrocław, Poland which is close to the German border. But honestly the need of fleeing immigrants is overwhelming. There are over 100,000 people waiting to cross the border into Poland. We are so proud of Poland's response to the crisis. Poles are doing everything in their power to help, transporting refugees and helping them find shelter, food, clothes. Because of the war, men 18-60 are not allowed to leave Ukraine, they must stay and fight. The majority of those coming to Poland are women and children and the wait is now over 24 hours at the border.

Last Sunday in anticipation of imminent war, through contact with another American missionary in Ukraine, we received a family of 5, including 2 kids and a grandma. They needed to quarantine here for 7 days. On Sunday they will continue on to Czech Republic where the dad has the promise of work and a work visa.

Yesterday evening we were connected with another young woman from Zimbabwe, Mahnoor, who has been studying medicine in Ternopil, Ukraine for the last 4 years. The airports have been destroyed and she was on a bus trying to cross the border to Poland last night. It is now noon on Saturday and we still haven't heard that she's made it across. She had to walk more than 20-30 km to get to the border. We have contacted other friends that will put her on a train to our city and we will host her until she can make travel arrangements home to Zimbabwe.

Tomorrow at church we will get more information about how the church is mobilizing to provide shelter for Ukrainian refugees. We have heard that the Fellowship through FAIR will be organizing a relief fund for helping refugees. We

will send out more information as it becomes available. Right now we know that they are converting some Christian camps in Poland into refugee shelters and are expecting 200 people in the next few days and asking for donations of clothes, toys and diapers.

We have a lot of dear friends that are Ukrainian, including former teammates of Krista's from Poznan, Sasha & Ania Zubenko. Our 2<sup>nd</sup> son, Elias' best friend is Ukrainian. His family immigrated to Poland 5 years ago. Krista's great grandparents immigrated to Canada from Western Ukraine in the early 1900's. Ukraine is near and dear to our hearts.

#### PRAY

- Pray for the safe evacuation of thousands of people heading for the border.
- Pray for relief efforts in Poland and for provisions of places to live, and work for so many refugees.
- Pray for the Ukrainian army as they try to fend off Russia on their own.
- Pray for the church to pray and respond with the love of Christ.
- Pray for God to change the heart of Putin.
- Pray for the Haviruk family as they try to make a new life for themselves in the Czech Republic, while mourning the loss of the home they knew and grieving the potential loss of cousins and uncles fighting Russia.
- Pray for Mahnoor from Zimbabwe, that she would make it safely to us and be able to travel home. Also pray that she would see the love of Christ through her evacuation and come to know Him as Saviour. She is Muslim.
- Pray that God would give us wisdom and show us where we can give, serve and bless those who are in deep need right now.

For our family, the war in Ukraine is not just a news article, but real people's lives. These are just 2 of their stories. Pray for the millions of people fighting not just for their freedom but for their lives right now. Pray that Putin would stop.
